

# National Science Foundation S-STEM Program in Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Math or Physics Indiana University Bloomington

## Description

The award is for up to

- \$4300 annually.
- Renewable for up to 4 years (8 semesters).

It may be combined with other awards but **not** comprehensive scholarships (21<sup>st</sup> Century Scholars)

- Students must submit a renewal application each year to maintain eligibility.

## Eligibility

Students that meet the following criterion are eligible to apply for the S-STEM Scholarship:

- **Major:** pursuing a degree in Astronomy/Astrophysics, Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics, or Physics.
- **GPA:** 3.0 or above on 4.0 scale
- **Citizenship:** US citizens
- **Enrollment:** full-time student (a minimum of 12 credit hours)
- **Need-based aid:** your family has completed a FASFA, and you are found eligible to receive assistance.
- Students with significant financial need and students from underrepresented populations are especially encouraged to apply to enhance the learning environments at Indiana University.

- Scholarships
- Faculty Mentors
- Undergraduate research experiences
- Internships
- Seminars and speaker series
- Career advising sessions
- Academic support services
